

## Instructions to the participants

Before coming to the summer school the participating PhD-students should send a short paper (2 500-3 000 words).

The paper should take a starting point in a short (max. one page) description of your research and after that include a discussion connected to the theme of research in the discipline social work. A couple of references from the literature are to be used. Participating in the summer school and presenting this paper, in text and oral, will give 4 ECTS. The paper should be sent to Kerstin Svensson ([kerstin.svensson@soch.lu.se](mailto:kerstin.svensson@soch.lu.se)) and Eva Johnsson ([eva.johnsson@soch.lu.se](mailto:eva.johnsson@soch.lu.se)) **before 2013-07-25**.

Those who want to continue their work after the summer school can write a longer paper (5000-6000 words) in which they include more of the literature in order to deepen the discussion. This paper will, together with the paper above, give 7,5 ECTS. The longer paper should be presented before September 30, 2013.

### ***How to use the course literature***

The recommended books are back ground literature for the papers and the course. They represent different perspectives in social science and are a foundation for the discussions in the course. The students' papers should address at least one perspective in relation to the research topic.

The articles contextualize social work research, and the students can choose articles related to their research topic in their papers.

Several of the articles are connected to the lectures and the doctoral students are supposed to read them before the course.
